WAES Inspection



A New Year gives us all the opportunity to reflect on what's been happening. For the Service, this includes successfully restructuring to make significant budget savings; fulfilling all our contracts to maintain our income; achieving success rates well above the national benchmarks with an overall success rate of 91%.

In particular, learners have enjoyed enhanced facilities in community venues; more and different learning opportunities such as Foundation Learning programmes; a new look Learning Services' area and a reinvigorated Learners' Council.

I'm, therefore, pleased to say that once again the Service will be in the spotlight this January. We have been selected to be inspected by Ofsted as part of the new Common Inspection Framework pilot inspection process.

The new Common Inspection Framework will include an increased focus on teaching and learning which will mean that Inspectors will be trying to understand even more thoroughly the impact of the teaching and learning that is taking place. There will be many opportunities for you, as learners, to give your views on the Service and its provision.

The last inspection in January 2009 resulted in the Service receiving a grade 2 'good' grade and this grade was reaffirmed in November 2010. We have been working hard since then to improve our services and resources even more to give you, our learners, the best possible opportunities for success in whatever path you follow on your learner's journey, whether it is learning for personal development or improving skills for work.

Safeguarding our learners is vitally important to us at the Service and we are committed to being proactive in the promotion of the safety and welfare of our learners, staff and visitors.


