ENGLISH

We have English classes for anyone who needs to start with the very first steps in reading and writing and for those who want to read, write and communicate better.

You can work towards qualifications including Functional Skills English from Entry Level up to Level 2 and for English GCSE.

If English is not your first language, you may need to join one of our ESOL classes (see English for Speakers of Other Languages).

We now have online Fast Track Functional Skills courses for students with a secure English background and are working at Level 2.

If you do not have a GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English your course will be free so you have nothing to lose.





ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language and you want to improve your skills to help study, find work or manage everyday life more confidently, then ESOL is the course for you.

Our ESOL classes will give you the written and spoken skills you need to use English in your life in the UK and help you to achieve your aims and ambitions for the future.

LIFE SKILLS (FOR LEARNING DISABILITIES, LEARNING DIFFICULTIES AND/OR AUTISM SPECTRUM CONDITIONS)

Life Skills Classes are ideal if you are an adult aged 19+ with a learning disability, learning difficulty or autism spectrum condition. The focus is on preparation for adulthood, independent living and moving you closer to employment. Practical activities could include cooking, arts and crafts, citizenship. English, maths and digital skills. Activities will focus on keeping yourself safe, healthy eating, travel planning, time management, exploring and being part of your community and improving vour work ready skills. (If you live outside of a West Midlands Combined local Authority area you may need to pay for your course).



MATHS

All our teachers are experts in their subject, they have many years' experience of teaching and will make maths fun and easy to understand.

We offer bridging courses across all levels, these are short courses to support you with brushing-up on existing skills before starting Functional Skills or GCSF.

We offer qualifications from Entry Level, Functional Skills, Level 1, Level 2 and GCSE. We now have online Fast Track Functional Skills courses for students who have a secure maths background and are working at Level 2.

If you do not have a GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in Maths your course will be free so you have nothing to lose.

LEARN SKILLS FOR WORK



SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT AND SUPPORTED INTERNSHIPS

These employment preparation programmes are ideal if you have a learning disability, learning difficulty or an autism spectrum condition and want to learn the skills to gain work. Take part in a 1-year programme with time spent between the classroom and a work placement where you will be supported by a job coach. When it ends, you will have gained skills to help you get a paid job, move to further learning or a Supported Apprenticeship. Our Supported Employment programme is for you if you are aged 19+ without an EHCP, and our and Supported Internship programme is ideal if you are aged 19-25 with an EHCP.

(If you would like to join a Supported Employment programme you may have to pay for your course if you live outside of a West Midlands Combined local Authority area)



INTRODUCTION TO PROGRAMMING

This qualification is designed for students to learn about the principles of computer programming and to understand how programming works. You will develop graphic-based programming skills to design and develop your own computer program.

Join our year-long course to enhance your employment opportunities or current career prospects. Topics include word processing, spreadsheets, presentation software and databases.

LEARN SKILLS AT A HIGHER LEVEL



DIPLOMA FOR THE EARLY YEARS WORKFORCE (EARLY YEARS EDUCATOR LEVEL 3)

Learn the skills to become an early years educator, ideal if you would like to move into a more senior position leading others. You will be able to work with children from birth to 5 years and gain knowledge of children aged 5 to 7. You will need to be working in or need to find a 2-day placement in an early year's setting to start the course.

SUPPORTING TEACHING AND LEARNING IN SCHOOLS (LEVEL 3)

Do you want to work in a school as a Teaching Assistant at a higher level?

We will give you the practical skills and knowledge to work with teachers in all aspects of specialist support, planning, delivery and reviewing assessment in the classroom. This is your chance to make a real difference to children's lives. Ask about our new qualification for Teaching Assistants with a SEND specialism.

You must already have or will need to find a 2-day placement in a school to start the course.



CERTIFICATE IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING TO ADULTS (CELTA)

CELTA is ideal if you would like a qualification to be able to teach English as a foreign language but have little or no teaching experience. It is the most widely recognised English language qualification in the world and the most often requested by employers.

One of your options may be to apply for an Advanced Learner Loan.

WHAT DO I DO NEXT?

Contact Student Services and we will give you more information and support you to make your decision. We will also help you with your application if you decide to apply for a loan. We recommend you apply for your loan as early as possible so that you can join your course on time. You may also be able to get help with your travel resources and childcare costs too.

You can speak to the Student Services Team who provide a range of support services to make sure every students learning experience is the best that it can be.


The 'Student Space'
